



AOPA European Region – Vice President's Summary

✤ Internal Challenges:



- → Some affiliates were able to grow their membership figures, whereas others had to struggle to keep their members and to pay their dues to IAOPA-HQ and IAOPA-Europe. Some AOPA affiliates are even inactive for years and give IAOPA a bad reputation. Creating a positive business case is the problem
- → Recruiting the next generation of AOPA volunteers is not easy
- → The war in Ukraine has meant that we currently have hardly any contact with our colleagues in Ukraine, Russia and Belarus
- → External Challenges:
 - → Bureaucrats become more and more formalistic, we need to defend EASA's concept of "lighter, better simpler regulations for GA"
 - ✤ Filing of Flight-Plans: FF-ICE
 - ✤ Part IS Information Security
 - ✤ Prolongation of medicals is a bureaucratic nightmare
 - → The public perception of GA as an environmental threat is causing us problems
 - → actions such as the spraying of aircraft by environmental activists happened, but are clearly diminishing.
 - → Environmental authorities are creating uncertainty with the transition to unleaded avgas
 - → However, we can also score points with the fact that the first all-electric aircraft are in GA and that the developments for environmentally friendly flying in commercial aviation are all taking place in GA.
